He found himself with a surplus of Christmas wreaths and remembered a childhood visit to Arlington National Cemetery. He reflected on how his good fortune could be attributed to the heroes that now rest eternally. He placed the extra wreaths on graves, and thus began the nationwide effort to remember, honor, and teach future generations what these men and women sacrificed to protect our country.

This year, Bosque Museum is proud to support Wreaths Across America, and the more than 2,000 registered cemeteries, including Clifton's cemeteries. For each wreath purchased, Bosque Museum receives a portion of the proceeds. Wreaths are \$15.00 each. To donate, go to www.wreathscrossamerica.org/pages/167443 and click the donate button.
