In the interest of public health due to the global pandemic, we have made the difficult decision to cancel this year's show.


Artists who have already sent in their entry fees, will be refunded. Our show sponsors have generously agreed to donate their contributions to the museum.

DURING COVID SHUTDOWN IN MAY AND JUNE

Thile many internship programs have been shutdown due to the global pandemic, the Bosque Museum ${\sf VV}$ hired four Baylor Grad Students to help with exhibits and collections management in May and June.

Dali Atchley, William Bullard, Ella Sykes, and Maree Yard worked on removing artifacts from exhibits for the renovation of the new Horn Shelter Exhibit and accessioning artifact donations into the PastPerfect database used by the museum. This process is essential to museum practices but rarely seen by the public. Every artifact donated to the museum must be assigned a three part artifact number for control purposes and be assessed for quality, authenticity, historical relevance, provenance, etc. The students have worked diligently over several weeks to catalog artifacts and help the museum with the backlog of donated items. The museum is grateful to the students for their assistance.

HORN SHELTER EXHIBIT RENOVATION ON TRACK

The Bosque Museum has begun renovation of our permanent exhibit on the Horn Shelter. Almost 50 years ago, avocational archaeologists Al Redder and Frank Watt discovered the double burial of an adult male and pre-teen girl that dated back 11,700 years ago. Their discovery was one of only 14 burials found that date to the Paleoindian period (13,500-9,500 years ago) in North America and the only double burial. A trove of artifacts demonstrated the sophistication and complexity of their ancient culture. It is one of the most important archaeological sites in the United States.

The new Horn Shelter exhibit at the museum will feature over 500 square feet of exhibit space that will reflect the most scientifically up-to-date information. It will educate our visitors on the importance of Horn Shelter and transport them to the world of the First Texans. This renovation has an estimated total cost of \$250,000. So far, our fundraising has successfully procured over \$200,000 from notable charitable foundations and generous individuals.
