


## The Gift Shop and Bookstore



The Bosque Museum saw an opportunity to tell a larger story than the single case that currently exists in the Museum. An estate legacy gift in 2022 allowed the planning process to begin. In 2023, the team at the Museum and MuseWork, an exhibit design firm, got to work. The goal was to tell not just the story of John Avery Lomax, but the story of his legacy and what his family is still working on today. The story also can be viewed looking before Lomax's life, as the family moved to Texas when John was just three years old, looking for the opportunities provided by the Chisolm Trail. The resulting exhibit mock-up is on the cover.

This year, MuseWork will begin the process of writing the text on the panels, and drilling down to the architectural plans. If all goes to schedule, look for the exhibit opening in early 2025!
