New Name, Same Art Show & Sale

Bosque County has both beautiful wildflowers and important historic structures to behold. The recently re-named Sights & Sites Art Show & Sale (formerly known as the Wildflower Art Show & Sale) gives the Bosque Museum a chance to feature both local artists and these subjects.

Because of the museum's mission to preserve and protect the history of the county, the theme of the Art Show has been expanded to include both native Texas Wildflowers and Historic Sites & Structures around Bosque County. This is a change that required a name change for the event, and the organizing committee is excited about this juried show.

The judge for the 2022 Sights & Sites Art Show & Sale is Bosque County artist Nancy Boren. Nancy is recognized as one of America's leading female artists. Her first painting was done at age 12, sitting next to her father, artist James Boren, as he painted at the Grand Canyon. She received her Bachelor of Fine Arts from Abilene Christian University. Nancy cites the influence of notable traditional painters in her work such as Sargent, Sorolla, and Fechin. Her work is part of the permanent collection of the Booth Museum of Western Art in Cartersville, Georgia.
