"Top of the Hill Country" Bosque Museum's 2023 Art Auction



Start your bidding! In 2022, a generous donor commissioned a work of art for the Museum that would reflect on the County's unique history. Kathy Tate was selected as our artist for this year's auction.

"Top of the Hill Country" is a 24 x 29.5 Oil on Canvas, and features the scenery of Bosque County looking north from Texas Safari Ranch. The artist, Kathy Tate, is a sixth-

generation Texan. Tate was born and raised in north central Texas. Between helping out on the family dairy farm, and raising her three sons, she found little time to paint during the day. Tate pursued her still-life artwork at night. Many of her still-life objects are items from old home sites or family heirlooms brought to Texas in the 1800s. Although she excels in still-life, architecture and life in Texas are often subjects in her work.

Tate's work has received numerous awards, is a member of many professional societies, and is on the roster of Artists in Residence with the Texas Commission on the Arts.
