Cleng Peerson

Cleng Peerson, birth name Klein Pedersen, was a Norwegian emigrant to the United States; his voyage in 1824 was the precursor for the boat load of 52 Norwegian emigrants in the following vear. That boat load was the main wave of Norwegian immigration to the United States.



Cleng Peerson May 17, 1783 - December 16, 1865

During 1854, the Texas State Legislature granted Peerson 320 acres of land west of Clifton, in Bosque County. Peerson live here until his death in 1865 and was buried in the cemetary by Our Savior's Lutheran Church in Cranfills Gap.
